Supply Chain Innovator

As part of our culture of thinking new and thinking ahead, AAR is developing **new digital platforms** that will provide our customers with Intelligent Solutions for buying/selling parts, and managing/ tracking component inventory, as well as repairs and warranties. Our MRO Services network began operation of the state-of-the-art **Airframe MRO in Rockford**, Illinois, that now employs over 100 aircraft mechanics repairing major carrier aircraft and is on track to ramp up next year.

We also made innovations in our long-standing Parts Supply business that contributed to a significant revenue increase over last year. In addition to buying/selling parts, engines and aircraft, we focused on **exchanges**, leveraging the inventory pools in our global warehouse network. We will soon have one centralized, enhanced 24/7 AOG desk with access to our components in the U.S., Brussels and Hannover. We also expanded our parts portfolio by adding a new product line — **ATR parts**, through the acquisition of ACLAS Global inventory serving ASL Group airlines, with a dedicated sales team in the UK.



Online Parts Store

Challenge: Expand online access to AAR's inventory of over 1 million parts including surplus/ serviceable and factory-new parts we sell in aftermarket for OEM partners.

AAR Solution: Create enhanced digital platform that makes internal database accessible to all existing/potential customers via easyto-use interface on website; also list key parts on other online exchanges and link back to AAR Online Parts Store.

Results: A B2C experience for B2B customers — sold hundreds of parts to new/existing customers with expedited quotes, same-day shipping, customer rates and real-time visibility to order status and order history.

AAR significantly expanded its flight-hour **component support** of commercial airlines outside North America and to new platforms (NEO, ATR & B737 MAX), growing from 12 to 32 programs, totaling more than 1,400 aircraft. Integrated Supply Chain Solutions now has contracts in **every** major region worldwide — Europe (added ASL Group, Enter Air & Small Planet); Middle East (added flydubai); Australia (extended Air Austral); Asia (added Air New Zealand); Africa (added SAAT); North America (expanded Allegiant) and South America (added Viva LatinAmerica group). AAR's award-winning component repair shop network in New York and Amsterdam expanded to Australasia under a new partnership with Air **New** Zealand component repair.

As part of our growing OEM Aftermarket Solutions, AAR was named an exclusive distributor for global commercial and military aviation markets by **Milton Industries** and expanded our existing agreements with **Eaton**, **Meggitt and UTAS**. AAR's worldwide network was further integrated to better serve customers with **new warehouses** in Dubai World Central (DWC) Airport and Shanghai.

Nose-to-Tail Support

Challenge: Provide nose-to-tail support for CommutAir's new ERJ 145 fleet, building on AAR's long-term relationship with this regional partner of United Airlines.

AAR Solution: Leverage AAR's breadth of services to provide comprehensive cost-per-flight hour & cost-per-landing support via: component repair in New York; wheel, tire & brake repair in Miami; and component management and access to pool parts through AAR's global warehouse network. Use AAR's new digital platforms to track work in real-time.

Results: Integrated offering from one supplier that will provide predictable costs & superior reliability to support this new fleet and CommutAir's growth.

The U.S. government remains an important market for AAR. AAR Airlift was awarded a new contract by the U.S. Department of State for the Global Aviation Support Services program to provide maintenance, operations and logistical support for the Department's International Narcotics and Law Enforcement Office of Aviation aircraft fleet for up to 11 years, which we hope to begin soon upon the resolution of the latest incumbent protest. AAR also continued to support USTRANSCOM with rotary wing airlift services in Afghanistan where Airlift and its predecessor have been operating in rugged terrain since 2005. Airlift attained NAAMTA Medical Transport Accreditation, enhancing our standard of care for aerial rescue services.

Order volumes increased in Mobility Systems and included **ISU® reset and repair** opportunities with U.S. Special Operations Command units and a U.S. Air Force contract for KC-46 palletized seating. A NATO contract for specialized storage/shipping containers should help continue this trend and also provides the foundation to launch an ISU® reset and repair facility in Europe in FY18. Mobility was also honored to support the Presidential Inauguration with its **containerized kitchen** used by the National Guard to serve meals to soldiers on site in Washington, D.C.

Prime PBL

Challenge: Provide total supply-chain management to support all U.S. Air Force and contractor requisitions received for all C-130, KC-135 & E-3 landing gear parts via a long-term PBL contract.

AAR Solution:

Leverage AAR's expertise in managing the repair, maintenance and logistics of landing gear with repair work in Miami and inventory supply & management in Wood Dale, IL, and Ogden, UT. Apply commercial MRO and supply chain best practices to help government increase efficiencies and reduce costs.

Dear Fellow Shareholders:

This year AAR debuted a brand refresh to help raise our visibility and build value in a dynamic global market. The new brand message is designed to better communicate the Company's breadth of aviation services and our unique ability to provide an independent single source for our customers' aftermarket needs.

Financial Results

Fiscal year 2017 was another solid year for AAR with diluted earnings per share from continuing operations increasing a healthy 32 percent over last fiscal year to \$1.45. The Company's sales grew 4 percent to \$1.77 billion, driven by sales growth in both the Aviation Services and Expeditionary Services segments. Sales to commercial customers represented 66.2 percent of consolidated sales with sales to government customers representing the balance. Our gross profit increased \$16.4 million in Aviation Services and \$22.2 million in Expeditionary Services. Cash flows provided from operating activities for continuing operations was \$24.2 million while net cash used in continuing operations was \$18.5 million as we continued to make strategic investments in our business, including assets to support new multi-year supply chain programs for customers, and return capital to shareholders through dividends and share repurchases.

Operational Highlights

In the Aviation Services sector, we experienced growth in our aircraft and parts supply activities and new contract awards for our Integrated Supply Chain Solutions worldwide. With new airline customers across the globe, we are now supporting over 1,400 aircraft, including next-generation aircraft platforms — A320neo and B737 MAX. Our ability to provide comprehensive fleet support was recognized in the government market with a \$909 million fixed-price contract from the U.S. Air Force for the Landing Gear Performance-Based Logistics One program. We also expanded our international support network entering into a component



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repair partnership with Air New Zealand and opening new warehouses in Dubai and Shanghai. The Parts Supply business added a new product line with the acquisition of ATR parts via a component support

contract with ASL Group in Europe. Our OEM Aftermarket Solutions group continued growth with new or expanded partnerships with Crane, Eaton and Milton. Continuing our goal to provide good-paying jobs to American workers, our 238,000 square-foot state-of-the-art airframe MRO facility opened in Rockford, Illinois.

In the Expeditionary Services sector, we are encouraged by increased volumes in our mobility business, coming off a historical low base. Mobility Systems was recently selected by the U.S. Air Force to provide KC-46 palletized seating and by NATO to provide containers and shelters.

Leadership Changes

This year we announced the retirement of two leaders who helped make AAR the success it is today, welcomed two new leaders, and promoted to President the next generation of leadership who will help me guide the Company to continued success in the future.

I have great confidence in John's leadership abilities and look forward to working with him to bring the Company to new heights.

I am pleased that we added Duncan J. McNabb to our Board of Directors. Duncan, a retired Air Force four-star general, brings to the role 37 years of military service experience, most recently as the Commander of USTRANSCOM, as well as other corporate board experience. Mike Milligan will join AAR as Vice President and Chief Financial Officer on September 1, 2017. I am confident he will be a great fit and that his 15 years of CFO experience will be a great resource for the Company.

Looking Forward

We have momentum going into Fiscal Year 2018. I feel very good about the capabilities we added in the past year, pleased with our execution, and confident that the investments we have made will fund our future growth. We will continue our business strategy to grow our integrated supply chain and MRO businesses organically, while looking for opportunities to supplement growth through acquisitions and partnerships. We remain disciplined in our approach to acquisitions, with focus on enhancing the value proposition we offer our customers, and the returns we provide to shareholders.

When I visit with our employees worldwide, I am impressed by their level of engagement and their desire to delight our customers which, as we saw in Fiscal Year 2017, is a great path to creating shareholder value. Thanks to our more than 5000 employees for their hard work, to our customers for their business, and to our shareholders for their confidence. We are also grateful to the Board for their dedication to excellence and the sage counsel they provided throughout the year. In all, we are poised to do an even better job of *"Doing It Right to better connect the world"* next year.

In support of health and wellness, we donated to the Brain Research Foundation, American Cancer Society, CURE — (Citizens United for Epilepsy Research), Mayo Clinic, and others to empower researchers in the effort to conquer diseases that impact us all.
